Rituals and Practices of Shin Buddhism — Instructor: Rev. Arthur Kauffman

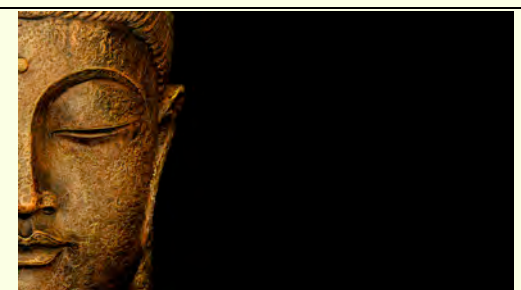

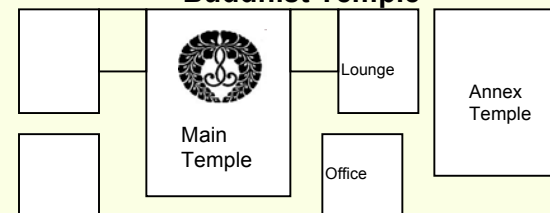
