## CONDOLENCE

**Mr. Robert Tsuneyoshi Matsushita**, a member of Wailuku Hongwanji Mission, passed away on January 29, 2014. Mr. Matsushita served as the President of Wailuku Hongwanji Mission from 1981 to 1982. The Ingo (Posthumous Title) of SHO-KYO-IN 正教院 which means “the one who lived and shared the Right Teaching” in recognition of his life of nembutsu was conferred by Bishop Eric Matsumoto on February 9, 2014.

**Mr. Sadamu Saiki**, a member of Lihue Hongwanji Mission, passed away on February 21, 2014. Mr. Saiki served as the President of Lihue Hongwanji Mission from 1994 to 1997. The Ingo (Posthumous Title) of KEN-TOKU-IN 建徳院 which means “the one who established oneself in virtue” in recognition of his life of nembutsu as a temple president, an army veteran, and dedicated member of the temple was conferred by Bishop Eric Matsumoto on March 7, 2014.

Five ministers from Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii participated in the Rainbow Ekiden on March 8, 2014 to raise awareness of Hongwanji in the community. In this Ekiden, which is a long distance relay race, each minister run 5km (about 3.1 miles) to their fullest to pass on the sash (baton) to the next runner by gratefully acknowledging receiving the many treasured traditions brought by immigrants to Hawaii and realizing the importance of passing on these traditions to future generations for a better Hawaii. Out of 120 teams, the “Hongwanji Ministers of Hawaii” finished the race in 29<sup>th</sup> place (total time: 2:12:38). Two Students from PBA (Nelson Bopp and Koki Atcheson) also participated in the race with three students from Chikushi Women’s High School, which is one of the affiliated schools in the Hongwanji Ryukoku Sogo Gakuen Group. Their Team “Team CJ & PBA” finished the race in 6<sup>th</sup> place (1<sup>st</sup> place in the Student Category, Total time: 1:48:43). Ministers expressed their deep appreciation to the many people who had provided support and encouragement.

### Lecture by Dr. David Loy “Why Buddhism and the West Need Each Other”

In this era of almost instantaneous communication and interchange of ideas and beliefs, the interactions and resulting transformations happen at a much faster pace. Therefore *Why Buddhism and the West Need Each Other* is an important topic in this era. By understanding the potential of the ideas and their influence on each other we can contribute more immediately to positive and productive transformations in the world.

In Dr. Loy’s view the highest ideal of the Western tradition is to restructure society so that it is more just. While the most important goal of Buddhism is to awaken spiritually, which ends *dukkha*, loosely translated as “suffering.” He puts forth a fruitful idea that the world needs both of these ideals. Not only because they complement each other but also because they in fact need each other.
